

Summary sheet 2: How to Reference Correctly

References should be listed at the end of a piece of work in alphabetical order by first author.

The volume number can be bolded, underlined or in normal type. Do not include part numbers.

Book references should include the date and place of publication, the edition (if there is more than one) and the name of the publisher.

Page numbers should be in the format shown.

For information obtained from the internet, always include the URL and accessed date. Increasingly used for articles from academic journals, the doi should also be included if available.

When referencing an authored chapter in an edited book, include the chapter authors, year and chapter title followed by the book details. Include the page numbers of the chapter at the end of the reference.

Use italics for the title of the journal, newspaper or book

Full journal titles are recommended, but abbreviated titles can be used; just be consistent!

Include all authors of an article in the reference, in the form: author surname, initials.. If there are two authors for an article, separate them with "and" or "&". Check the original publication to ensure all accents and initials of authors' names are included.
