| DO use: | DON'T use: |

| Creative Commons resources with a compatible licence | YouTube resources which include infringing material |
| Limited extracts from your own work | Logos/Trademarks without permission |
| Your own photographs of everyday objects | Photographs taken within restricted environments (ie. archives, galleries, exhibitions) without permission |
| Sources where the licence terms explicitly permit your type of re-use | Extensive extracts from your own published work <u>without</u> checking your contract |
| Items out of copyright | Items from unknown sources or where copyright cannot be ascertained |
| Short quotes from published work <u>as long as</u> they are properly referenced | Screenshots which contain identifiable pictures or other personal information |
