#### **Participation of students at the University of Leicester 2017/18**

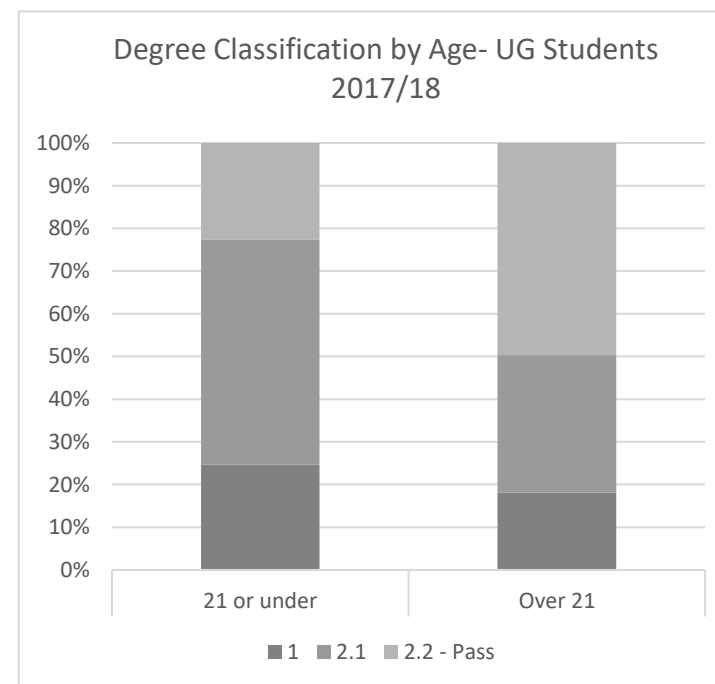

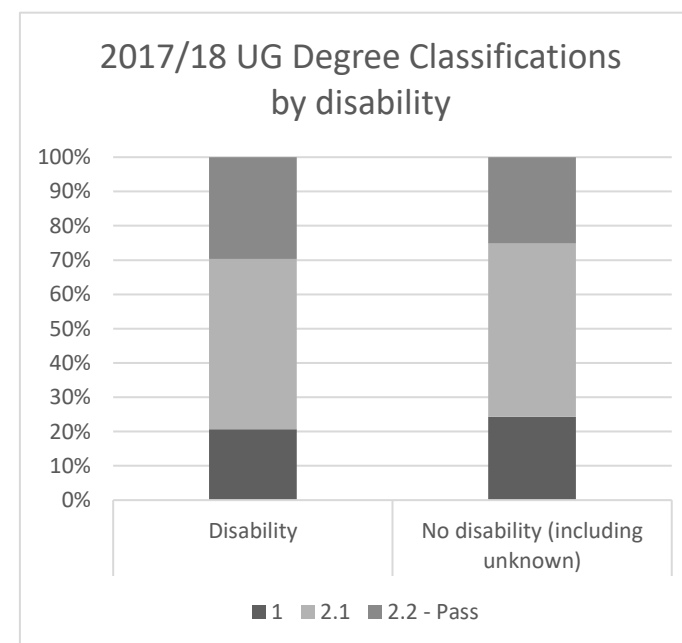

In 2017/18, 70.3% of UoL disabled first degree undergraduate qualifiers received a first/2:1. In the UK, in 2016/17, 73.2% of disabled first degree undergraduate qualifiers received a first/2:1

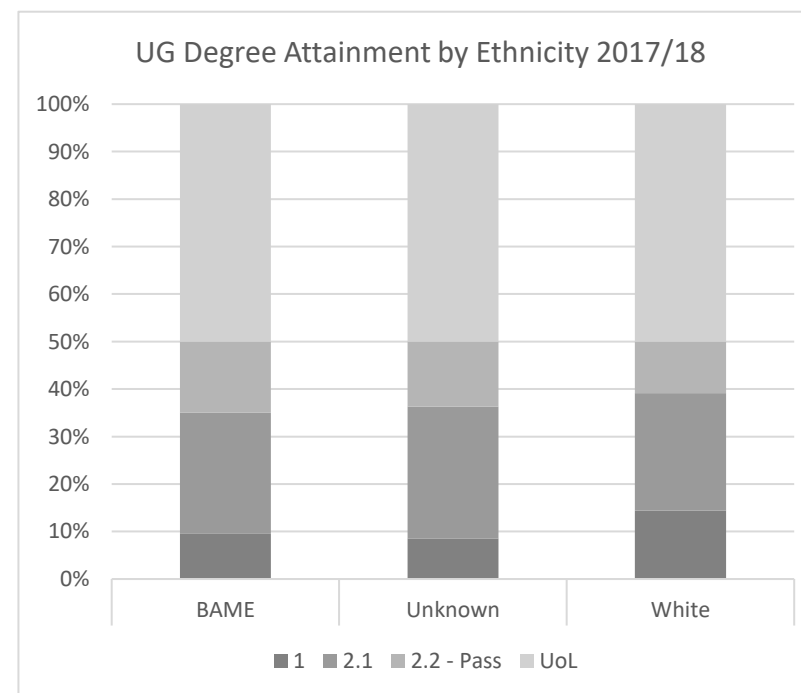
The proportion of BAME students at UoL has steadily increased since 2015/16, in 2017/18 41.7% of all UoL students identified as BAME. In 2016/17, of those whose ethnicity information was known, 49% identified as BAME.

In 2017/18, 78% of white students received a first/2.1 compared with 70% of BAME students, representing a BAME degree attainment gap of 8 percentage points.

The Equality Challenge Unit (now part of Advance HE) reported that in the UK 79.6% of white students received a first/2:1 compared with 66.0% of BME students in 2016/17, representing a BME degree attainment gap of 13.6 percentage points.

The proportion of gender balance of students at UoL has remained static since 2015/16. The higher proportion of female students aligns with UK figures, in 2016/17, 56.7% of all students studying in UK higher education were female.

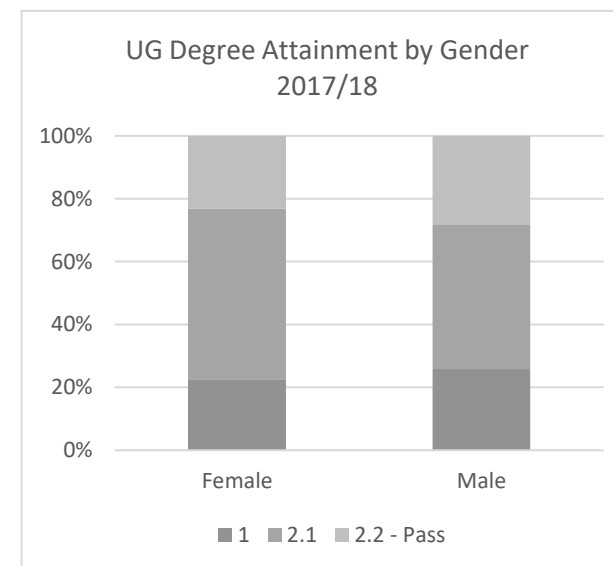

In 2017/18, 77% of female first degree UG qualifiers received a first/2.1 compared to 72% of male first degree UG qualifiers. This aligns with national figures, in 2016/17, a larger proportion of female first degree undergraduate qualifiers received a first/2:1 than male qualifiers (76.8% compared with 72.2%).

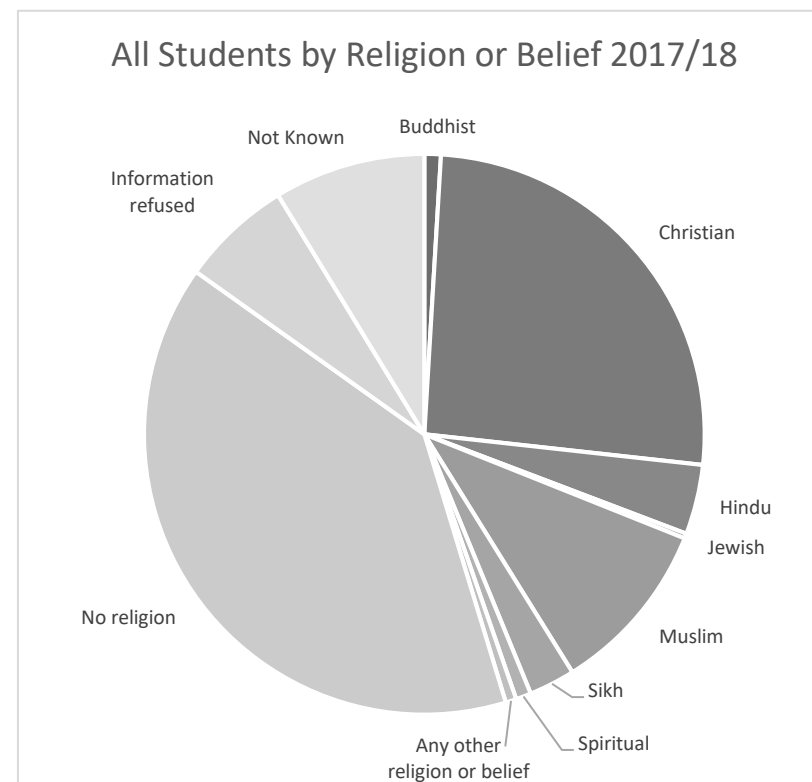
